This December we developed a powerful cohort of twenty anti-racist facilitators, who have trained over one-hundred people within the HDC community.

The pre-exhibit workshops

have provided a foundation around racial identity, our understaning of race and racism, and naming how white privilege operates in society. The post-exhibit workshops will focus on strategy, action and next steps.

Workshop facilitator and Building Changes staffer, Meghan Morales reflects on her experience, "The entire curriculum provides an excellent opportunity for participants to start thinking about how racism is playing out in our communities and time to discuss action-oriented next steps towards racial equity." We are thrilled by the passion, leadership, and commitment coming from the HDC community.

For those who have not plugged into a pre-workshop, we have a small batch of tickets set aside for groups that seek to view the exhibit and attend a post-exhibit workshop. <u>If</u> <u>interested</u>, <u>please have one organizational</u> <u>representative fill out this request form</u>.

In addition to this project, HDC will be rolling out tangible action items to further racial justice -- an Organizational Assessment Tool, a Study and Action Kit, and a Membership Convening to celebrate and discuss next steps.
