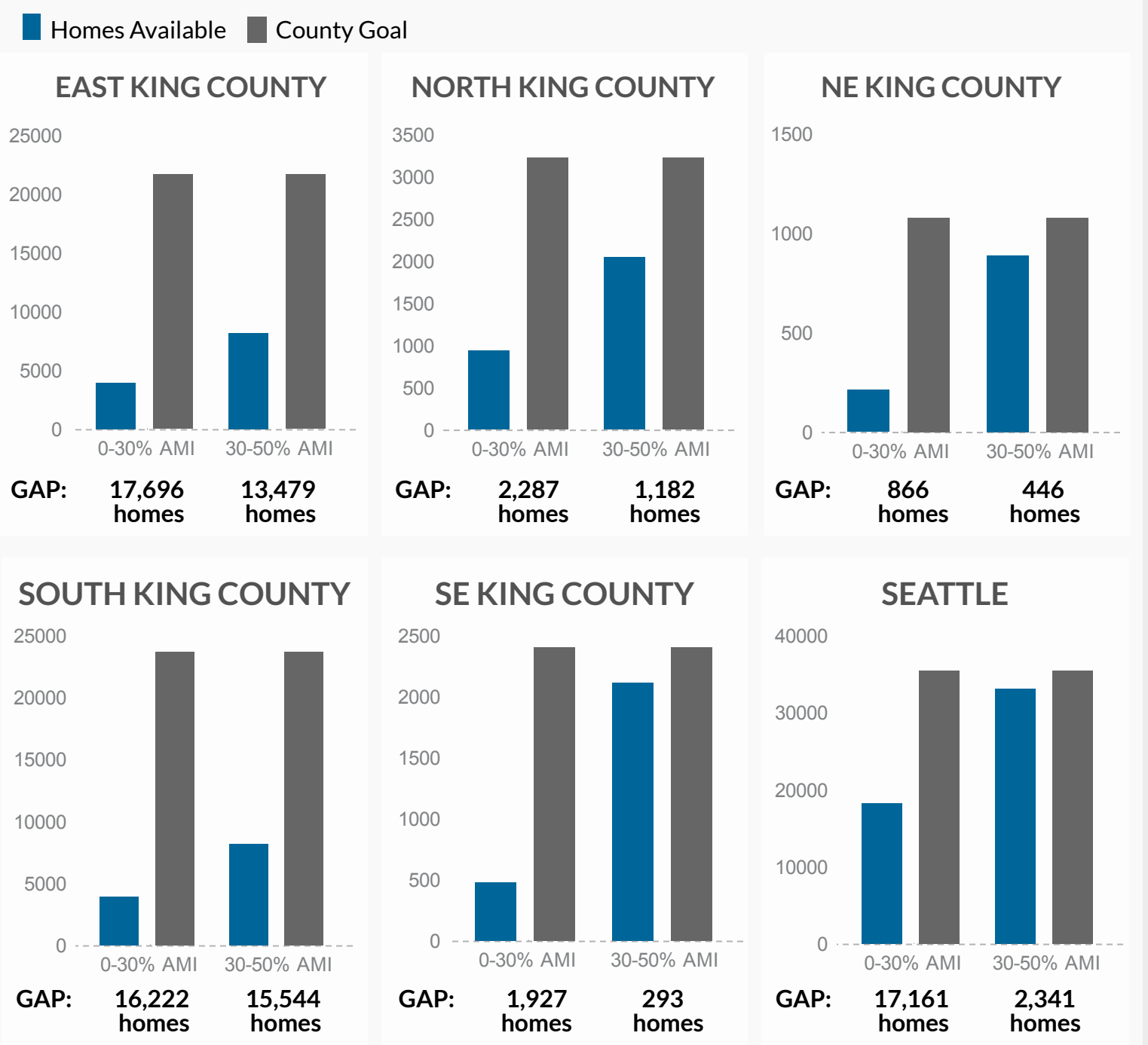


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## Affordable Housing Gaps by Region

Gap calculations are based on King County goals, which are not necessarily reflective of existing demand. Meeting a county goal does not imply that there is enough housing stock to meet the needs of households of all incomes in a particular city.

- 🏠 No city in King County is meeting the proportional need for homes affordable to households with incomes  $\geq$  30% AMI
- 🏠 King County's affordable housing gap is largest for households with incomes 30% AMI or less
- 🏠 Gaps are largest in Seattle, North, and East King County
