### **Position announcements:** Affiliate part-time instructor

The University of Washington's Runstad Department of Real Estate seeks applications for a part-time appointment commencing in January 2020. The individual selected will be teaching a course in *Accounting for Real Estate* in the winter quarter of 2020 (January 6, 2020 – March 29, 2020).

*RE 400 Accounting for Real Estate* provides an introduction to accounting concepts in relation to development and management of real estate assets. Subject areas covered include: understanding balance sheets, income statements, annual reports, GAAP accounting and standards, federal and real estate property taxation. This course is part of the Real Estate undergraduate minor and is also taken by master students without a business background.

Applicants with at least a Master's degree in a relevant field and teaching experience strongly preferred although professional experience will be evaluated accordingly. All applicants are asked to include a teaching statement. This document (approximately 1-2 pages) should describe the goals you will have for students taking your class and discuss how your teaching will enable students to reach these goals and will create an inclusive learning environment.

The Runstad Department of Real Estate was established in 2017 and builds upon the long-standing provision of graduate real estate education in the College of Built Environments. It offers a Master of Science in Real Estate, an undergraduate minor and Graduate Certificate programs in Real Estate and Housing Studies.
