

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, all people should have access to safe, healthy, and affordable homes; and

WHEREAS, studies have found that each \$100 increase in median rent results in a 15 percent increase in homelessness in metropolitan areas and a 39 percent increase in homelessness in nearby suburbs and rural areas; and

WHEREAS, the 2020 Point In Time Count found 11,751 people experiencing homelessness in our community; and

WHEREAS, Black, Indigineous, and People of Color are overrepresented in the homeless population; and

WHEREAS, King County as a region completed a comprehensive and coordinated effort through the Regional Affordable Housing Task Force to develop a regional plan for addressing affordable housing needs, including identifying collective tools and options to create and preserve more affordable housing countywide; and

WHEREAS, the Regional Affordable Housing Task Force found that over 100,000 households in King County are severely cost-burdened, which means they paid more than half of their income for housing; and

WHEREAS, severe cost burden disproportionately affects Black, Indigineous, and People of Color; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has layered an immediate housing emergency on top of a long-term crisis, creating economic uncertainty for thousands of families in King County, jeopardizing their ability to pay rent, and putting them at risk for eviction once the statewide moratorium on evictions ends; and


WHEREAS, the King County Executive and King County Council endorse the aims, objectives, and purposes of Affordable Housing Week, and recommit themselves to the goal of safe, healthy, and affordable homes for all county residents;

in King County and encourage all county residents to assist in advocating to build, preserve, and subsidize affordable housing in our communities.




